The meeting opened with the Lord's Prayer. The minutes from the June 8, 2020 meeting were read and approved.

Discussion began with the Webster School property. Mark Bushman is still trying to get a quote on a building. Isaac Bailey reported around 20 donors purchased mulch for the playground, the softball teams are using the concession stand with a temporary generator, and Chase Greulich is working on putting up more signs. Isaac Bailey mentioned there is interest in having a car show on the property to raise money for maintaining the fields. Isaac Bailey made a motion to cover the cost of the portable restroom until the softballs teams are able to reimburse the township. Mark Bushman seconded the motion and all were in favor. Isaac Bailey would like to put up a pavilion in the middle of the playground that won't interfere with any future buildings. Julie Foos will check with the Prosecuting Attorney's office about how to handle donations. The Trustees and Randy Aspacher discussed some trees that need to be trimmed or removed at the Webster School property, and on Dunipace and Devils Hole Roads.

Mark Bushman discussed the stone section of Anderson Road with Brett Askins at the County and is waiting on a quote for cutting down the bank. Brett Askins advised rolling the road after a big rain. Mark Bushman also asked the County to get some figures on fixing the corner of Silverwood Road and State Route 105. The County also advised eliminating the catch basin along Silverwood Road that does not serve any purpose. Isaac Bailey made a motion to tear out the catch basin and fill it with concrete. The motion died for lack of a second. Mark Bushman will ask for a quote from the County first. Julie Foos worked with Jason Sisco at the County to finalize the bid packet for improving Main Road. The bids will be opened at the next meeting.

There was nothing to report on the fire and EMS contracts, abandoned houses, or replacements for the zoning boards.

Isaac Bailey reported there are 27 miles of roads that could be sprayed as part of the roadside spraying program. The Trustees discussed spraying Caris, Stony Ridge, and Layman Roads, as well as Devils Hole Road from Luckey Road to State Route 199. Jim Cajka made a motion to do five miles of spraying. Isaac Bailey seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Isaac Bailey reported it would cost roughly \$11,000 to replace all of the 911 address signs in the township. Mark Bushman proposed to continue paying for signs for new houses, but leave replacing the signs up to the residents.

Julie Foos and Mark Bushman reviewed the rules for the Webster Township Cemetery and will present the changes at the next meeting.

Dave Welling reported he has received many questions concerning a lot for sale and if it is buildable. Dave Welling issued a warning to a resident to move an accessory building to conform to the required setbacks.

Mark Bushman mentioned a resident on Swan Road would like to tap into a catch basin put in by the County and wondered if there is a permit. Dave Welling confirmed there is nothing in the Zoning Resolution about drainage issues.

Julie Foos read Resolution 20-005, a Resolution to Proceed, Tax in Excess of Ten-Mill Limitation in regards to the fire and EMS levy. Isaac Bailey moved to accept the resolution. Mark Bushman seconded the motion and all were in favor in a role call vote.

Mark Bushman made a motion to accept Resolution 20-006, a Contract to Furnish Emergency Management Between Wood County, Ohio and the Township of Webster, as written. Jim Cajka seconded the motion. Mark Bushman and Jim Cajka approved, and Isaac Bailey opposed. The motion passed.

Julie Foos reviewed the portion of the CARES act that applies to townships, but does not believe Webster Township qualifies to receive any money.

Jim Cajka made a motion to continue to work with Huntington Bank. Isaac Bailey seconded the motion and all were in favor. Julie Foos will renew the Depository Agreement.

Mark Bushman will be the township's representative to attend the Wood County Township Association meeting on July 9.

Julie Foos will continue to put together a newsletter to send out to every township resident.

The Trustees agreed to have Envirocare look at removing and chipping the tree at the Webster School property.


Jim Cajka mentioned a tile has broken down on Dunipace Road. Jim Cajka will ask the County to handle it. Jim Cajka also asked about the drainage problem on Luckey Road. Isaac Bailey said the County will stake the right of way first and decide what to do from there.
