The meeting opened with the Lord's Prayer. The minutes from the February 10, 2020 meeting were read and approved. The Fiscal Officer's report was also approved.

Isaac Bailey made a motion to have the Chairman be the point of contact for the Engineer's Department. Jim Cajka seconded the motion and all were in favor.

In 2020, Chase Greulich will mow the Webster Township Cemetery for \$400 per mow and the Webster School property for \$120 per mow. Chase Greulich is interested in mowing the Old Belleville Ridge Cemetery for \$80 per mow if Joe Kirkman is no longer interested. The Trustees talked with Chase Greulich about updating the 911 signs throughout the township and making stencils for the Webster Township Cemetery. Jim Cajka asked if Chase Greulich would be interested in doing some extra maintenance at the cemeteries this summer. Isaac Bailey made a motion to pay Chase Greulich the same hourly rate as Randy Aspacher, which is \$20.50 per hour. Jim Cajka seconded the motion and all were in favor. Chase Greulich left the meeting.

Chris Voland asked the Trustees if it would be acceptable to wait a few years to tear down the house on the property he inherited on Stony Ridge Road as long as he keeps the grass mowed and the weeds under control. Burning the house is not a good option because of the EPA's regulations. The Trustees agreed that Chris Voland's plan is acceptable as long as the frontage is maintained. Jim Cajka mentioned the township might be able to use its truck to haul some loads to the landfill. Jim Cajka also said although there is no grant money available through the County or the State, the Eastwood Community Improvement Corporation might be a resource. Chris Voland left the meeting.

Dave Welling gave his report on zoning. Dave Welling has issued two permits so far. There are four variance requests coming up with three scheduled for March 10 and the fourth scheduled for March 17. Dave Welling confirmed that the barn that was built without a permit is intended for agricultural use. The Trustees and Dave Welling talked about the lots for sale on Luckey Road and any zoning implications.

Julie Foos reported the Blue Ribbon Rangers 4-H Club will not apply for the grant, but will still do their community service project at the Webster School property on April 18. The roadside clean-up will go from 8:30 A.M. until noon, and the Webster School property clean-up will begin at noon. The Trustees and Randy Aspacher will look over the property after the township meeting on March 9 and will work on hauling away of the junk.

The snow plow did some damage to Aufderstrasse Road near Sugar Ridge Road. The Trustees discussed the best way to fix it.

The Trustees reviewed the quote from Rutter and Dudley for fixing the driveway at the Township Hall. The Trustees will ask a few other contractors for quotes as well.

There was nothing to report on the fire and EMS contracts or the roadside spraying program.

Julie Foos relayed a complaint from a resident about the months he waited to get the footer poured for his wife's gravestone at the Webster Township Cemetery. Mark Bushman clarified it has always been his policy to pour footers twice a year, once before Memorial Day and once in the fall. Mark Bushman informed the Trustees of the times he has been stuck paying light load charges or ends up not getting paid for his work.

There was nothing to report on the abandoned houses issue.

Isaac Bailey made a motion to table the Fire and EMS levy discussion. Jim Cajka seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Mark Bushman made a motion to table the health insurance renewal discussion. Isaac Bailey seconded the motion and all were in favor.

The Trustees approved the Road Mileage Certification.

Jim Cajka mentioned that he and his daughter Emily cleaned up all the wreaths from the Wreaths across America program.

Isaac Bailey reported he filed a Sheriff's report about a pickup driving through the fields off the stone section of Anderson Road.

Randy Aspacher relayed pricing on pallet forks. Jim Cajka made a motion to spend up to \$700 on forks. Isaac Bailey seconded the motion and all were in favor.




